Avoid potential tree & wire conflicts by planting utility-friendly species. Look for the for symbol meaning the species is utility-friendly. Before you dig, call for the location of all underground utilities. American Hornbeam

Amorpha fruticosa Ht: 15-25 ft, white showy blooms

Cornus florida Ht 15-30 ft, showy white flowers

Gray Dogwood 🕢

Cornus racemosa Ht: 10-15 ft, deer tolerant

Crataegus viridis Ht: 20-35 ft, showy flowers, has thorns

Maclura pomifera Ht: 35-60 ft. Medium growing deciduous tree. Tolerates poor soils, & drought.

Overcup oak

Quercus lyrata Ht: 40-60 ft, great shade tree!

Pagoda Dogwood 🚺

Cornus alternifolia Ht: 15-25 ft, showy flowers, attracts birds/butterflies

Pawpaw

Asimina triloba Ht: 15-30 ft, edible fruit, purple blooms, tolerates wet soil

Pecan

Carya illinoinensis Ht: 75-100 ft, edible fruit

Persimmon

Diospyros virginiana Ht: 35-60 ft, edible fruit

Post Oak

Ulmus americana Ht: 50-70 ft. shade/street tree

Red Buckeye

Aesculus pavia Ht: 12-15 ft, showy red flowers. **River Birch** Betula nigra Ht: 40-70 ft, deer tolerant

Rose Mallow

Hibiscus lasiocarpos Ht: 4-5 ft, pink/white flowers, good for pollinators

Roughleaf Dogwood

Cornus drummondii Ht: 6-15 ft, tolerates most soil conditions

Downy Serviceberry 3.15

Amelanchier arborea Ht: 15-25 ft, white showy blooms

Shellbark Hickory 15

Carya lacinosa Ht: 60-80 ft, needs a large space

Shortleaf Pine 3, 15 Pinus echinata

Ht: 50-60 ft, evergreen, prefers sandy soils

Shumard Oak 3, 15 Quercus shumardii Ht: 40-60 ft, tolerant of most soil conditions

Silky Dogwood Cornus obligua Ht: 6-12 ft, tolerates shade

Smooth Sumac 3 Rhus glabra Ht: 9-15 ft, showy flower; rabbit, drought & erosion tolerant
