St. Louis City Forestry is working to expand our tree canopy. Over the next 4 years, 3,200 street trees will be planted across 10 wards. Additionally, these trees will be watered! Thousands of existing street trees will also be pruned, all to enhance the City's canopy.

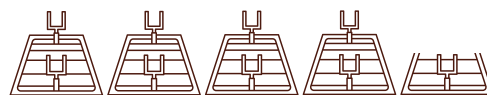
IMPACT TO DATE IN WARD 1...

- 66 street trees pruned

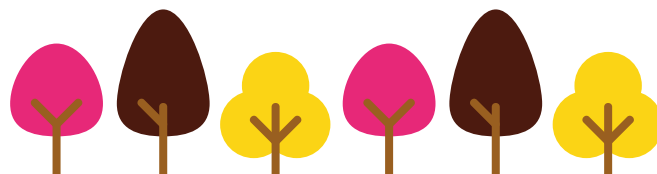
More trees are coming in Fall 2025. Look for the pink signs!

OTHER TREE NEWS...

- Carondelet Park is undergoing a huge woodland restoration managed by Forestry's Natural Land Management Team. It includes over 1,100 trees being planted in the 12 acres just north of Boathouse Lake that also includes a new mountain bike trail. An additional 60 trees were planted around 2.5 acres across from the YMCA.
- 15 trees were planted in Carondelet Lions Park last spring
- Trash for Trees is a local group whose mission is to get trees in yards by hosting sponsored trash cleanups. Find the group on Facebook and join the effort!
