



St. Louis City Forestry is working to expand our tree canopy. Over the next 4 years, 3,200 street trees will be planted across 10 wards. Additionally, these trees will be watered! Thousands of existing street trees will also be pruned, all to enhance the City's canopy.

OTHER TREE NEWS...

- Ruth Porter Mall received 70 trees that have been establishing for the last 2 years, enhancing the St. Vincent Greenway
- 12 memorial trees were planted at Ivory Perry Park with Better Family Life to honor lives lost to gun violence
- An allée of oaks along the walking path at Gwen Giles Park, plus other shade trees were planted in fall 2021. These 34 trees have anchored park enhancements as the new Hodiamont Greenway development launches this year.
- Parkland Park had 26 ash trees removed and 30 new trees planted in 2022 thanks to Treesilience funding that continue to be stewarded and monitored by Forest ReLeaf.
