

TREE IMPACT REPORT WARD 11 April 2025

St. Louis City Forestry is working to expand our tree canopy. Over the next 4 years, 3,200 street trees will be planted across 10 wards. Additionally, these trees will be watered! Thousands of existing street trees will also be pruned, all to enhance the City's canopy.

IMPACT TO DATE IN WARD 11...

- 164 street trees planted
- 3 street trees pruned


More trees are coming in Fall 2025. Look for the pink signs!



OTHER TREE NEWS...

- Fairground Park has received consistent tree investments since 2021. An allée of 10 cherry trees at the corner of Natural Bridge & Fair are 2 years established and offering spring beauty. More than 70 additional shade trees have been planted.
- 30 new trees were planted at Rumbold Park in December to replace 20 dead trees that had lined the park
- 19 memorial trees were planted at Eugene 'Tink' Bradley Park with Better Family Life to honor lives lost to gun violence
- Tree distributions have been hosted at the historic Scott Joplin House site for the last 2 springs. Stay tuned for one coming this fall!
