St. Louis City Forestry is working to expand our tree canopy. Over the next 4 years, 3,200 street trees will be planted across 10 wards. Additionally, these trees will be watered! Thousands of existing street trees will also be pruned, all to enhance the City's canopy.

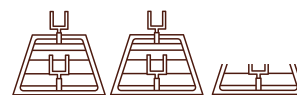
IMPACT TO DATE IN WARD 13...

- 126 street trees pruned

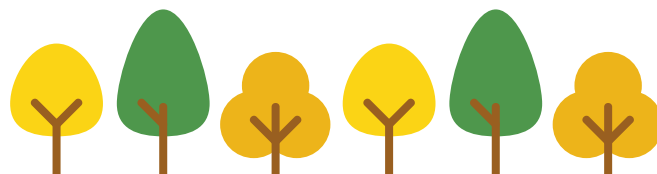
More trees are coming in Fall 2025. Look for the pink signs!

OTHER TREE NEWS...

- Over the last 3 years, more than 400 trees have been planted in North Riverfront Park in partnership with Great Rivers Greenway. In 1990 the site had received thousands of young seedlings that were all but a few washed away in the flood on 1993. The site had stood mostly bare except for invasives like bush honeysuckle that block the view of the river. The new trees are supported by the Chain of Rocks Community Association, helping to promote a thriving & beautiful riverfront.
