

## TREE IMPACT REPORT

St. Louis City Forestry is working to expand our tree canopy. Over the next 4 years, 3,200 street trees will be planted across 10 wards. Additionally, these trees will be watered! Thousands of existing street trees will also be pruned, all to enhance the City's canopy.

## IMPACT TO DATE IN WARD 14...

- 199 street trees planted
- 16 street trees pruned


More trees are coming in Fall 2025. Look for the pink signs!



## **OTHER TREE NEWS...**

- 30 trees planted in Hyde Park last October.
- Peace Park in College Hill has new trees. Green City Coalition is growing native trees AND fruit trees! Volunteers needed!
- 211 trees are being stewarded across Loretta Hall Park, Jackson Place Park, St. Louis Place Park and on 14th Street.
- Old North Restoration Group is planting, and now watering, dozens of new trees.
