

TREE IMPACT REPORT

St. Louis City Forestry is working to expand our tree canopy. Over the next 4 years, 3,200 street trees will be planted across 10 wards. Additionally, these trees will be watered! Thousands of existing street trees will also be pruned, all to enhance the City's canopy.

OTHER TREE NEWS...

- In partnership with Great Rivers Greenway, the Christy Greenway has had
 60 new trees planted. 30 more trees will be planted on 5/3/25. Volunteers welcome!
- A tiny forest of 500 native trees & shrubs appeared in 2023 along River de Peres Greenway extension near Germania Ave. In 2024, the trees outpaced the weeds. The area is being monitored for success.
- Friends of Willmore Park have planted more than 40 trees over the last 3 years in the park. Additionally, they host Roots & Rescue -- a one-day adoption event of native trees from Forest ReLeaf and puppies from Stray Rescue!
- Trash for Trees is a local group whose mission is to get trees in yards by hosting sponsored trash cleanups. Find the group on Facebook and join the effort!
