St. Louis City Forestry is working to expand our tree canopy. Over the next 4 years, 3,200 street trees will be planted across 10 wards. Additionally, these trees will be watered! Thousands of existing street trees will also be pruned, all to enhance the City's canopy.

- 90 street trees planted

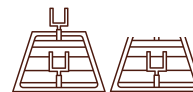
More trees are coming in Fall 2025. Look for the pink signs!



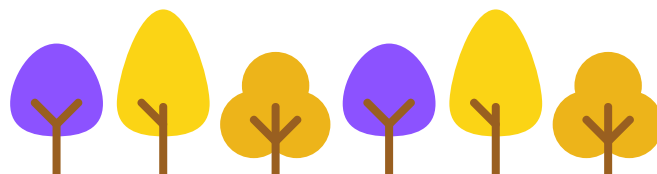
OTHER TREE NEWS...

- 30 trees were planted in Laclede Park last October to replace lost ash trees
- Alderman Cohn helped to fund the removal of dying ash trees in Minnie Woods Park and Mt. Pleasant Park, along with new trees being planted in both parks by City Forestry
- Students at St. Mary's High School received trees through Forest ReLeaf's CommuniTree program to plant 15 new trees on their school grounds
